Regarding the processing of personal data under the Article 13 of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)

1. Responsible party

2. Data protection officer

No data protection officer has been appointed, as there is no statutory obligation to do so.

3. Purposes of data processing and legal grounds

Personal data is collected and processed in order to secure places for pupils at schools in the United Kingdom (England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland). Personal data is disclosed to the schools so they can determine whether or not the pupil is suitable for a place. The schools are then also able to contact pupils and their parents directly in future.

Data processing is carried out to enable us to fulfil our agreement with you (i.e. the task you charged us with of finding a suitable school for your child). The data is processed in accordance with Article 6 (1) (b) of the General Data Protection Regulation.

4. Types of data and data subjects

The type of personal data we process is initially only that which is required to send you our brochure. Once the application process is initiated, further data is required as per the attached application form requests.

This data pertains to:

- the pupil
- the pupil's parents or, if applicable, his/her legal guardian
- the pupil's siblings

5. Processing for legitimate interests' purposes

No data is processed for legitimate interests' purposes (Article 6 (1) (f) of the General Data Protection Regulation). Our purpose is solely to fulfil the agreement we entered into with you.

6. Recipients / third country

The data is disclosed to selected schools in the United Kingdom. We will always inform you which schools receive the data as soon as we forward it to the schools.

7. Duration of data retention

We will store our correspondence with you for ten years (in line with our duty to store it under the German Commercial Code (HGB) and Value Added Tax Act (UStG)). Thereafter, your communication data will be deleted. If your child attends a British boarding school or a summer school, your child's data will be stored for ten years after the start of his/her time at the school in the United Kingdom before being deleted.

8. Right to access, rectification, erasure, restriction and data portability

You are entitled to receive access to the personal data concerning you at any time. Likewise, we will correct your data if it is inaccurate. In such cases please use the contact information above to notify us. Please also let us know if you would like to exercise your right to restrict, delete or have your data transferred.

9. Right to lodge a complaint

If you have cause for complaint, please contact us using the contact information above. Likewise if you become aware of an infringement of data protection.

You may contact us at any time regarding the processing of your personal data. You also have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority. This may be the authority responsible for your place of residence or the authority responsible for us: the Bayerisches Landesamt für Datenschutzaufsicht (Bavarian State Office for Data Protection Supervision).

10. Provision of your data

The data relating to yourself and your child that you provide us with is done at your own free will. Please only give us the data that you and your child are willing to disclose. We will contact you if the data provided is not sufficient such that it might jeopardise the successful organisation of a placement at a school.

11. Automated decision

For our part, we do not operate an automated decision-making process that is not doublechecked by a human being.
